Senior Animals Have Special Needs

Senior Wellness Exams Provide Hidden Answers

Studies have shown that as many as **20%** of senior dogs that appear healthy upon physical examination have an underlying disease. Once symptoms appear, the conditions may be too difficult or costly to diagnose or treat. A **Semi-Annual Senior Wellness Exam** can include laboratory tests so sensitive they can detect the onset of diseases and conditions early, when treatment and prevention are most effective.
